Occasionally, we may take photographs/videos of the children at our school. We may use these images as part of our school displays, in printed publications that we produce and also on our school website. We may also make video or webcam recordings for school-to-school conferences, monitoring or other educational use.

If we use photographs of individual pupils we will not use the name of that child in the accompanying text or photo caption. If we name a pupil in the text, we will not use a photograph of that child to accompany the article. If a child has won an award and the parent would like the name of their child to accompany their picture we will obtain permission from the parent before using the image.

From time to time, our school may be visited by the media who will take photographs or film footage of events. Pupils may appear in these images, which may appear in local or national newspapers, or even on televised news programmes.

It is important that we protect your child/young person's interests. Schools have a duty of care towards pupils which means that pupils must remain unidentifiable if images are to be used in this way.

In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we need your signed consent before we can photograph or make any recordings of your child for promotional purposes. I should therefore be grateful if you could answer the questions overleaf, then sign and date the form where indicated and return the completed form to the school office.

Withdrawal of consent can be given at any time by written instruction which should be submitted to the school office.
